Between the 16th and 18th centuries, many thousands of refugees fled from religious persecution in the Low Countries and France. These refugees left descendants in Britain and many people have family stories of Huguenot descent. This talk will help you find out if you too have an asylum seeker in your own family tree.



Dr Kathleen Chater has been tracing her own family history for over 30 years. She has taught genealogy and has written books and articles on the subject, including *Tracing Your Huguenot Ancestors* and *Tracing Your Family Tree in England, Ireland, Scotland and Wales*. Transcription

I suppose what we really need to do is start off by defining 'What is a Huguenot?' Now, strictly speaking, Huguenots were French Protestant refugees who left France under Louis XIV. This was mainly after about 1680. However, they left for reasons of religious persecution. We don't include among the Huguenots people who left France because of the French Revolution (they were political refugees), so it's quite a narrow description, definition. However, when the Huguenot Society was formed in the 19th century they decided to include in their remit to do research as well on previous religious emigrants who were driven out of their countries because of their Protestantism. This included the Walloons from French speaking Flanders, the Dutch from the Netherlands in the 16th century and also earlier waves of Huguenot, of French people fleeing from France, especially the Massacre of Saint Bartholomew of 1572, but there were people coming at other times and from other places.

England Tips for Researching Nonconformist Ancestors - International Institute

Researching English Non-Anglicans [edit | edit source]

Welsh religious denominations have a very different history and a far greater percentage (up to 80%) of Nonconformists than in England. The influence of Roman Catholicism and Presbyterianism, as well as these countries' separate record systems, render Scotland and Ireland separate subjects for denominational study.

The history of many groups is quite complex with many divisions and amalgamations. The intent of the chart below is to show the approximate earliest use of terms that will be encountered in the records.

HUGUENOTS IN THE BETHNAL GREEN SETTLEMENT EXAMINATIONS

1839-1861

Unfortunately, very little poor law material survives for the East End parishes of London in which Huguenots mostly settled, and nothing early enough to shed light on their origins in France. The settlement examinations of the Bethnal Green Board of Guardians at the London Metropolitan Archives are a rare survival.

Settlement examinations were carried out to establish which parish was responsible for the payment of poor relief to the individual being examined. Everyone acquired settlement by birth except that illegitimate children were chargeable to the parish of the mother. Men acquired a new settlement by apprenticeship, paying rates, or being employed for more than a year; married women also automatically acquired the settlement of their husband.

Examinations can thus be fairly detailed. One in this series gave the mother's age, occupation and recent addresses, the dates of her two marriages (with the fact that her first husband died at sea), some information about both husbands' parents (with the fact that they were dead and the address of an aunt of her second husband), the name of her own father with the fact that he had always rented houses in Bethnal Green but had died in Hanwell Asylum. Her two children had each the surname of one of her husbands but each was stated to be illegitimate and the name of the father was given. A genealogical treasure trove as the enquirer was descended from the second illegitimate child and the father's name was not given on his birth certificate.

The following is an extract of the Huguenot names (subject to the usual qualifications) from the first

seventeen books, covering the period from November 1839 to February 1861.

Note that the series is not complete. The following is an analysis of the coverage:

Brains Trusts

This is an edited transcript of the proceedings of two Brains Trusts held at The Society of Genealogists in November 1967 and January 1969. We make no apologies for lateness of appearance as the questions and answers selected for publication (which have been numbered here continuously) remain of importance and interest. The Chairman on both occasions was Mr. L. R. Muirhead while the "brains" have been fully identified as and when they first appear.—F.L.

one or two Unitarian and a couple of Baptists. I think it is quite clear from this that the others—any of them who had been keeping good registers—would also have been exempted from the provisions of the Act.

MRS. LEECH: I should point out that the Huguenot registers were completely independent. When the Protestants returned to England on the accession of Elizabeth I they were put under the jurisdiction of the Bishop of London but were allowed to maintain their own churches without interference. At the time the order went out for Nonconformist registers to be collected; they were all sent in and are now in the Public Record Office. In spite of the Act, the Huguenot marriage registers did not cease in 1754 and recommence in 1837 and many were continuous.

CHAIRMAN: The answer seems to be that if you kept your registers well you were exempt from everything!

MR. CHITTY: I have seen an instance of a double baptism in both the Dutch and the English Church.

MISS SCOULODI: The Dutch and the French both came under the same Huguenot Charter, but were not in communion with the Church of England. At the time of the Restoration there were two groups, the Conformists and the Nonconformists. In the end the Conformists (roughly the Savoy Group) agreed to take the service and rites of the Church of England translated into French, but the Nonconformists (roughly the Threadneedle Street group, now in Soho Square) continued with their own rites which went back traditionally to the old Calvinist groups who came to England in Elizabeth's reign.

MR. CAMP: I cannot think of a single instance of a marriage in a Huguenot Church between 1754 and 1837, though the earlier ones were all indexed in Boyd.

Question 7: Apart from the records of The Huguenot Society and the Home Office Indexes of Naturalizations, what sources of information can the team suggest for foreigners trying to trace branches of their families who have emigrated to this country for religious, political or economic reasons? (Anon.)

MR. CAMP: I cannot think of any apart from the records of The Huguenot Society and the Indexes of Naturalization by Act of Parliament, Local and Private Acts.

MR. CHITTY: It all depends on the definition of "Huguenot"—there were other foreign churches in London which were not strictly Huguenot, such as the Dutch Church in Austin Friars, which have their own records.

CHAIRMAN: There was also the Protestant Italian Church that used to be in the Liberty of the Rolls. This seems to me a question which The Society might well investigate.

MR. HAMILTON-EDWARDS: There are, of course, the lists of emigrants who came to England during the time of the French Revolution kept by the Duc de Broglie, which are in the Public Record Office.³

Barraud: The Story of a Family. By E. M. Barraud, 1967. The Research Publishing Co. Illustrations. Index. 190 pp. 50s.

This is a record of one of the many Huguenot families members of which have been distinguished in various professions in this country. Philip Barraud (d. 1732), who migrated from Angoulême, was naturalized with a number of other Huguenots by Act of Parliament in 1704. Philip was a merchant. He married in this country rather late in life, Frances, daughter of William Prevost, a Huguenot and engraver by trade. His eldest son, Philip (1724–1799), an engraver probably chiefly on silver, published a book of 600 cyphers in 1782. With the exception of the frontispiece these were all designed and engraved by him. A copy of his book is in the British Museum. Another son, Francis Gabriel (1727–1895), married Magdalen, daughter of the well-known Huguenot silversmith, Paul Crespín (1694–1770). Francis Gabriel was distinguished as a watch and chronometer maker, and was founder of a London firm which existed until 1929. Several members of the family went into that trade, the most distinguished being his son, Paul Philip (1752–1820), a biography of whom is about to be published. Incidentally, Miss Barraud notes that Paul Philip, when he married in 1782, was the first of the family to marry into a completely English family, which shows how clannish some Huguenot families were.

It was in the 19th century that several members of the family became distinguished as artists, notably the brothers William (1810–1850), and Henry (1811–1874), best known for their sporting paintings. A son of Henry Francis James (1856–1924), painted *His Master's Voice*. The story of the painting is told by Miss Barraud. It was not commissioned or indeed painted with a view to its sale to the Gramophone Company which bought it. To the Company's credit, when later it had become famous and a

Lart's Huguenot Pedigrees

Charles Edmund Lart

Charles Edmund Lart, Captain, 4th Battalion, Devon Regiment, T.D., who died at Harpford near Sidmouth on the 30th of June, aged 80, himself of Huguenot descent, was the leading English authority of his generation on French and especially Huguenot genealogy. He was born 17 March 1867 the son of Captain Edmund Lart, 18th Hussars, by his first wife Christiana, daughter of David Dewar of Dunfermline, Co. Fife. He was at Westminster School from 1882 to 1886 and at Corpus Christi College, Cambridge, 1886-9. He served for many years in the Territorial Army. From October 1914 to 1916, when he was invalided home, he served in India with the North-West Frontier Field Force. Later he held the post of Musketry Training Officer to the New Zealand Rifle Brigade at Tidworth. His familiarity with the French Records and the national and departmental archives of France was the basis of an unique knowledge of Huguenot origins, and on points arising in this field he was for many years consulted by the officers of arms and others. Among his publications were: *Jacobite Extracts from the Parochial Registers of St. Germain en Laye*, 1910; *Huguenot Pedigrees*, Vol. I, 1926, Vol. II, 1928; and *The Pedigrees & Papers of James Terry, Athlum Bernald at the Court of James II in France*, 1938.

Mr. Lart was married and leaves a son and two daughters. Two other sons died on active service during the war.

Reg. Vitre); (j) Emée-Suzanne, (e) bapt. 8 Feb. 1692 (Par. Reg. Vitre); (k) Renée, bapt. 28 May 1693 (Par. Reg. Vitre).

NOTES.

(A) It has not been possible to identify Guillaume Legge. The family is said, without proof, to be a Branch of the Earls of Dartmouth. "Grand Justicier de Paix" probably means a magistrate or "Haut Justicier" and not a Judge of the High Court. The term "Haut Justicier" means a Seigneur who had the High, Middle, and Low Justice.

(B) Two sons of Richard Legge and Suzanne de Gennes are said by Frain to have gone to England—probably Richard Charles and Pierre. They do not appear to have been naturalised.

(C) Jean Legge and Marie Anne (or Anne Marie) had four sons and four daurs., baptised in the parish church of Vitre after 1685. Several of the des Pommaries family came to England and were naturalised.

(D) John Legge, who took the Sacrament 21 Jan. 1699-1700 at St. Anne's, Westminster, was probably the son of Jacques


